THE BOWLING EVENT IN GAY GAMES III

The Bowling Event itself in Gay Games III made a number of departures from the event in the original Games I and II for a number of reasons that we hope will be continued in the Games to come. The process to achieve medal status was built on three criteria: Skill, Endurance and

Competition at One's own level.

SKILL: The basic premise for men and women bowling in the Games was built on the fact that with average divisions and skill and practice, men and women could compete equally against each other without prejudice towards the men. The singles event was run separately in the three divisions for men and women but all other events (Doubles and Teams) were any mix. In pursuit of this, we designed a format wherein we looked for consistency of performance and ability to hit well over a large number of games, as opposed to one-shot wonders. Thus the elimination of stepladder competition for example. Why should someone be knocked out of a medal by losing in one game when the person has shot consistently high for 16 - 20 games. In my mind, the person who achieves excellence over a large number of games is the true champion, not someone who plods along over the week and suddenly gets hot in one game.

ENDURANCE: We certainly achieved what we wanted here. We looked for a format that would demand a great deal physically from the athletes who bowled. This meant that in singles for example: you bowled four games: we then took the top 25% of the participants and they rolled a further three games. The scores were cumulative and the top ten in each


average division went on to roll a round robin format with bonus points to determine placement. The people who achieved medals in the singles divisions rolled 16 games in two days to get there. The endurance standards should never be lessened. We are looking for our true champions, not just people who are having a good week or a good season. We followed similar formats for Doubles and Teams. If you were in all three, and some were, you could bowl a total of 46 games that week.

COMPETITION AT ONE'S OWN LEVEL: The most important contribution we made to bowling in the Games was the introduction of divisions. Finally there was a reason for the 130 or 160 average bowler not only to play, but to achieve excellence in their own level. The divisions we used were 0-140, 141-170 and 171+ for singles and doubles or five times those amounts for teams. I am very pleased with the success of these divisions, although I would recommend changes in the future; fine tuning perhaps with the addition of another division, say 171-185 and 185+.

The other significant suggestion was that it was time that we started to think about a seniors division and perhaps the next Games should consider this. Our surviving population is aging and there is a real need to cater to the over fifty

groups in gay and Lesbian bowling.

The final analysis is that the sport of bowling in the Games should continue to grow to represent the ultimate achievement for our people in our sport. We must work hard to insure that a medal achieved in bowling is a true accomplishment. It lessens the importance of the Games if your medal is achieved against a small field or because you happened to be in a competition that is not a constant winnowing until a true victory is achieved by a great athletic effort. We must be always on guard to insure that standards of excellence are always maintained.
